ACCOUNTABILITIES

The Hepatitis C Treatment Nurse provides direct treatment, support and education in collaboration with interdisciplinary care teams and partner agencies. They work with current and former drug users and the homeless in mid-West Toronto as part of a joint initiative between PQWCHC and SRCHC.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

Direct Client Care

- Provide comprehensive client centre care in multidisciplinary environments throughout the community that results in the optimal quality of care and treatment for clients
- Provide support and service to clients through all stages of HCV care and treatment
- Review patient referrals with program teams as well as patient's eligibility for treatment
- Assess patient drug insurance coverage and assist with the completion of application forms when necessary
- Have an understanding of the various financial assistance or compensation programs available to people infected through the blood system
- Routinely compile and enter data as per program directives and organizational requirements
- Liaise with community partners & provide community education sessions as required
- Ensures that standards of client care are maintained according to accepted College of Nurses standards, the Regulated Health Professions Act, and the policies of PQWCHC
- Makes internal referrals to other PQWCHC staff as appropriate, and externally refers clients to specialists, hospitals or community resources as appropriate
- Participates in case conferences with other providers to ensure coordination of services to the client
- Performs necessary back-up clinical functions for other nursing staff in their absence

Health Promotion and Education

- Collaborates with teams across the organization to identify and provide health education to target groups

Administrative/ Organizational Functions

- Maintains complete and accurate records sufficient for timely communication with other professionals
- Provides statistical information as required
- Participates in all relevant PQWCHC programs, activities, meetings, professional associations, and workshops as required
