- Harm Reduction knowledge, with emphasis on those with lived experience

Parkdale Queen West Community Health Centre (PQWCHC) has been operating for almost 45 years. We position health as a state of complete physical, mental, social and spiritual well-being and acknowledge that health problems may be caused by social inequality and disadvantages that affect access to resources. So, our approach to community health encompasses all the factors that determine health, such as education, employment, income, social support, discrimination, environment and housing, among others.

We provide primary care, counselling, health promotion, harm reduction, community development and advocacy supports. Our priority populations include youth and adults who are: homeless, living with mental health issues, living with substance use issues, Indigenous Peoples, seniors, LGBTQ individuals, immigrants and refugees. We offer services to people living in the area bordered by Bloor Street, Yonge Street, the lakeshore, and Parkside Drive. These boundaries do not apply for individuals who are homeless, Indigenous Peoples, or those accessing our dental or harm reduction services.
